Prince George's ACT celebrates second anniversary

Hyattsville, MD--July 19, 2005--Prince George's Advocates for Community-based Transit (Prince George's ACT) will celebrate its second anniversary at a special August meeting that will include Prince George's County Councilmember David Harrington as a speaker. The celebration will be on Monday, August 8, at 5pm, at the Hyattsville Municipal Building, 4310 Gallatin Street, Hyattsville, MD. The municipal building is served by Metrobus Route 83 and by TheBus Route 13.

Councilmember Harrington represents District 5, including Bladensburg, Cheverly, Edmonston, Fairmount Heights, Glenarden, Landover, Colmar Manor, Cottage City, and Mitchellville. He has served as mayor of Bladensburg and as president of the Port Towns Community Development Corporation. Currently, he is the chair of the County Council's Transportation, Housing and the Environment Committee and vice chair of its Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee.
